The Priest's Corner

Future Forward Churches Conference

Four of us went to this important conference. One part of it focused on how to recognize when a church is dying. The majority of the conference helped us understand when your church is reviving, moving away from the downward spiral and rising toward growth. Being a "glass half-full" person, I, of course, didn't care much for the dying cycle information for many reasons, one of which was having to live through our church's dying cycle. Can you believe that only two years ago when I was just starting to minister more intentionally, meaningfully and



obviously to our children, I actually heard from a couple people that I was taking too much time at the beginning of the service talking to the kids? I knew this was a bad comment to hear; I learned at the conference that the comment actually was a death knell. I am happy to report that I've not heard such a comment for about a year and a half now. BTW, I refused to allow that comment to enter me.

I also heard wanderings and comments about the length of our Peace Exchange. In fact, I thought more than once that we might need to shorten this. Thank God I was in Florida in August. We went to an Episcopal church there and at the Peace this church pretty much did it as we do at St. Brendan's. People were moving all over the church. Then the deacon went to the microphone and started saying, "The Lord be with you! The Lord be with you!" I heard it and suppose looked confused or not sure what to do next when two older ladies said, "Ignore her – she's always trying to get us to stop!" And they and everyone else just kept right on hugging, shaking hands and greeting each other. I felt naughty, but loved it.

This conference helped me to understand that when your church is engaged in a rather long, loud Peace Exchange, this is a sign of life. This is far from dying; in fact, it heals and fixes us a good bit. People today are becoming more and more isolated and



disconnected especially as texting, do-it-yourself encouragements and online social media, (especially gaming) takes the place of real-time, interpersonal connection. Many people are starved and need this connection. Interesting fact: if you think the 10:00 a.m. liturgy has a hefty Peace Exchange, the 8 o'clockers have 10 o'clock beat. I often just sit down, watch with awe and wait! Now remember, it's hard sometimes for our newer guests to walk around. I've watched how these newcomers seem to come alive when a few of our regulars come to them. (BTW, I consider you a regular once you're at church four times — even earlier for some of you.)

One other thing that struck me, which I never knew before, was this. If people don't connect within four visits, they will likely not return. So, my dear "frozen chosen," we would do so much better if we got rid of that little defense mechanism that says, "Don't overwhelm them!" "Don't be pushy." Seriously? Realize, no one in our church is pushy. And even if one or two of you feel as such, just know I'd rather you err on the side of energy than on the side of apathy or shyness.

You understand, don't you, that people have been to our church way before they enter our narthex for the first time. They are on our website way before we see them face to face. Their first connection with us happens way before we meet them. They know stuff about us, especially a church like St. Brendan's whose DNA is risk-taking, edgy, brave and interesting. We attract the same. Be yourself and approach others as you are comfortable, but don't presume our guests are fragile, handle-with-care visitors. They are people who, because of their high self-esteem, decide to look around and find a fit. Greet them accordingly; you've got lots to give and receive. It's your church. As you know, the priest(s) will



eventually leave — never let them be, second to God, the biggest draw. After God, the community needs to be the biggest draw.

Verdict! St. Brendan's is alive and has a real good chance to stay alive and perhaps even thrive, depending on a number of factors. Please know it's up to you whether this will continue. In the near future, I'll be sharing my vision for thriving. I'd love to hear your thoughts and visions.

presentation and address your questions and concerns. [PLEASE NOTE: (a) If the weather is inclement, we will carry on with the instructional program but save the drill for a later date. (b) A shorter presentation will be made at the end of the 8:00 service.]
