### The Priest's Corner

#### **The Opioid Crisis**

**Thursday** 

At least 130 people a day die from opioid overdoses in the United States, reflecting a dramatic rise in addictions to prescription painkillers, heroin and synthetic opioids, such as fentanyl. You might know that the Episcopal Church, our Region III, our diocese, your priest, all are deeply involved in addressing this pandemic.

Thirty of us from across Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland and D.C., including Bishop Michael Klusmeyer from West Virginia, travelled to Huntington, W.Va., for a pilgrimage throughout the city to learn: "What it was like, what happened and what it's like now." The state of West Virginia has been hard hit by the opioid pandemic and is filled with bleak statistics and grim stories; Huntington has been called "the epicenter of America's opioid epidemic." The city of about 50,000 on the Ohio River drew national headlines in 2016 for a cluster of at least 20 nonfatal overdoses in a 53-hour period, and in 2017 Huntington and its surrounding Cabell County logged 1,831 nonfatal overdoses and 183 deaths. Officials estimated about 10,000 people in the county were addicted to drugs out of a population just under 100,000.

West Virginia, due to its high rate of physically exerting occupations, was a city ripe for pharmaceutical companies to target as "needy" for pain-relieving drugs like OxyContin. While there, I heard a statistic of "473-1 available doses" of the highly addictive drug being sent to the state. So there were 473 of those little white pills available per person there. Apparently when noticed, a ban was placed on the drug, which resulted in now-dependent patients hooked on the drug and turning to their only option — heroin off the streets.

We, the Episcopal Church's Province III, found in Huntington a city now credited with becoming the "epicenter of recovery," There is a real "resurrection story" here. Thanks to solid partnerships between government agencies, health care organizations and church leaders, all following the lead of one prominent Episcopalian, Mayor Stephen Williams, the city is being born again. We spent two hours with the mayor, who described Huntington as a "city of solutions," the most notable being the quick

response teams on standby to respond to every overdose call. Clergy members across faiths and denominations have been trained as members of the teams, along with police, paramedics and addiction-recovery counselors.

Mayor Williams said, "Opioid addiction is a disease. We need to first and foremost seek to save lives, transform lives." In the process, he said, the whole community is transformed for the better. The mayor gets credit from many corners for rallying the community to work toward a solution. In September 2014, he issued a call to prayer in a letter to all congregations in Huntington. This sparked an energy, at least in the faith communities, according to clergy with whom I had a chance to speak. One last thing the mayor told us, and I think this is crucial, was, "You can't arrest your way out of this."

The Opioid Task Force of Province III came to be when the Episcopal Church called on all dioceses and congregations to respond to the opioid epidemic. The 79th General Convention passed a resolution in July urging Episcopalians to partner with those in their communities on the front lines of the crisis and to help create resources for education, prevention and pastoral care. Bishop Klusmeyer said, "We have to get the church in a leadership role." Another important role the Episcopal Church can play is to spread a message of compassion and hope as people suffering from addiction work to rebuild their lives, with the realization that "they're not just drug addicts, but they're human beings."

There are so many takeaways from this experience. Here are some of them:

- 1. Now that we have eight volunteers for the Cuddling Ministry, I'd like to get two to three volunteers to visit Lily's Place (here's the web site: <a href="www.lilysplace.org">www.lilysplace.org</a>) and see if we can replicate their ministry to wean babies off opioids. There are only two of these places in the country.
- 2. We need to have Narcan available at the church. It's becoming standard operating procedure for informed churches.
- 3. I'd like to introduce somewhere within our liturgy "The Serenity Prayer." For those secretly suffering from an addiction this is code that says, "We are a safe place here for you to ask for help."
- 4. As we offer gluten-free bread for those who suffer from this life-threatening allergy, we need to offer grape juice as an alternative for those suffering from another life-threatening allergy.

I am so grateful to have been on this pilgrimage to Huntington. Good news is that in 2018 this city reduced its overdosing crisis by 40%. Hope abounds.
