The Priest's / Children's Corner

What is Children's Chapel? And why are we doing it?

This is probably more for the adults in your life than for you, but why do we want to have a children's chapel? After all, if we are at church shouldn't we be AT CHURCH?

Yes. Absolutely. But

Sometimes in church, the readings are in language young people don't really understand (and honestly, some older people don't understand it either) so one of the big differences between what the adults hear and what the children hear will simply be the translation of the Word – Children's Chapel will use the Children's Lectionary.

Also, in church we use the Book of Common Prayer or Bulletins. These assume everyone can read at a pretty high level. Do you remember two years ago, Pastor Julie printed the Children's Book of Common Prayer, Rite II for young people and let you color and put your names on your own version? We still have those AND I've printed more. The nice thing about these versions – they are yours. You can color in them and they have pictures to help you follow along with where we are in the service so you can match what is happening to the image you see.





And a third really big difference is we are explaining what is happening in church as we do church. For right now, we will try to be outside, except for the last Sunday of the month which will continue to be our Sunday inside the church. But for right now, we can be a little less formal, a little less structured while we learn about God, and Jesus, and how to be church together.

So, look for the canopy outside. Bring your lawn chair or a towel, mat, or a blanket if you want to lie down and come to Children's Chapel.

Senior Warden's Corner

My parents never owned a car (indeed, they never even learned to drive), so when I was a child, our family used public transportation all the time. We learned at an early age never to trust the printed bus timetables. Despite their black-and-white assurances that a given service ran "every twenty minutes," experience taught us that buses actually move around in bunches with seemingly endless, vacant intervals in between.

This sometimes seems like an apt metaphor for the way that life treats us—both as individuals and as communities. One crisis knocks us off balance and another comes along right behind it. We don't get the chance to regroup between blows, to regain our equilibrium, and so the next jolt is even harder to absorb and move past.

At St. Brendan's, we have encountered a number of unexpected turns in recent months as friends have moved out of state, fallen seriously ill, undergone surgery, passed away. Each moment would have presented challenges on its own, but their cumulative effect is considerable—on our clergy and staff, on those who knew them well or worked with them at church, and indeed on the parish as a whole.

We will, of course, continue our best efforts to support those directly impacted by each event, both in prayer and in practical ways. But let us also recognize that this is a time for us all to be kind to one another, to acknowledge what has been an exceptionally stressful period in the life of our parish, and to ask God for the gift of renewed hope and trust as we re-center our lives and move forward.

Background: Jesus proved his disciples teachings for how to follow Torah as God's word; he told them parables to help them discern questions of ethics and of human nature; he offered them beatitudes for comfort and encouragement. But sometimes Jesus spoke words that followers then and now have found difficult. He instructs disciples to hate members of their own families (Luke 14:26), to act as if they were slaves (Matthew 20:27), and to sell their belongings and give to the poor (Luke 18:22). He restricts his mission (Matthew 10:6); he speaks damnations (Matthew 8:12); he calls Jews the devil's children (John 8:44). Amy-Jill Levine is a University Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School and College of Arts and Sciences. An internationally renowned scholar and teacher she is the author of numerous books. She is also the coeditor of Jewish Annotated New Testament.



Haitian Project: At St. Brendan's we have been supporting one of our members, Isaac, who is committed to helping people in his homeland of Haiti. We have been collecting clothes and other used items for him to send to Haiti. Last year, Isaac completely filled a used truck which he had purchased with many donated items. It was driven to Miami and then sent on a boat to Haiti. A few of the items were damaged by a leak in one corner of the truck, and Isaac has taken precautions to prevent leaks from happening again. Most of the items survived the trip and are now being used and appreciated by the Haitians. You can see pictures of

children using items that were shipped on top of the donation box in front of the church.

Now Isaac has bought two used school buses. One is completely full for shipment to Haiti. We need donations of summer clothes and shoes for adults and children. The adult sizes are medium to small but all sizes of men's shirts can be used. Also needed are bikes, cookware, tools, gardening tools, sewing machines, crutches, wheelchairs, walkers, cribs, towels, bedding, sleeping bags and comforters. If you would like to purchase something, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and bars of soap are appreciated. We will be collecting for 6 weeks or so.
