The Priest's Corner

Sacraments: Baptism and Eucharist

In the Episcopal Newcomer's first meeting, we explored prayer and the BCP (Book of Common Prayer). This coming Tuesday we will begin discussing Sacraments in the Episcopal Church. We have seven, and all of them are "outward signs, instituted by God to give Grace." This is Roman Catholic language. Episcopal language makes the same theological expression but with more directness: "outward and visible signs of inward and spiritual grace." In other words, sacraments are "earthly signs of heavenly activity."

We further differ in our wording about these seven sacraments from the Roman Church in that we distinguish two of the sacraments (Baptism and Eucharist) from the remaining five (Confirmation, Healing, Reconciliation, Marriage and Ordination). The first two we call dominical (taught by Jesus); and the other five we call ecclesial (taught by the church). The BCP is somewhat inconsistent but largely refers to the first two as sacraments and the last 5 as sacramental rites. In terms of our theology all seven are clearly sacramental. They all are outward signs of inward and spiritual grace.

Let's talk about the first two: Baptism and Eucharist. Baptism is how we get into the family of Christ. The sacred meal, Holy Eucharist, is what we as a family do together. We do Baptism only once; Holy Eucharist is the sacrament that Episcopalians experience most often.

In the Episcopal Church as well as the Roman Catholic Church, there is a fundamental principle that is best expressed by this Latin phrase: Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi, Lex Vivendi. Loosely translated, these words mean "the law of prayer is the law of belief is what we do." In other words what we pray is how we act—our belief becomes us and so we do. Prayer therefore expresses what we do. I will conclude this corner by sharing the crowning prayers that explain Baptism and Eucharist. I ask that you pray these and allow their words to give you the useful understanding of these two essential sacraments.

For Baptism: "Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit, you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give each of them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen."

For Eucharist: "God our Father, whose son our Lord Jesus Christ in a wonderful Sacrament has left us a memorial of his passion: Grant us so to venerate the mysteries of his Body and Blood, that we may ever perceive within ourselves the fruit of his redemption; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."

Senior Warden's Corner

In most Episcopal parishes, November is Stewardship Month—and our parish is no exception. At St. Brendan's, however, we like to manage the details a little differently. In my comments at last Sunday's service, I stressed that our annual stewardship reflections focus first on all that we <u>value</u> most about our life together as a community of faith. This approach, we feel, is more appropriate than a dollar-centric fundraising drive. (How many remember the Jerry Lewis Labor Day telethons of the 1980s?) We trust that our fellow Brendanites will make the obvious connection between the ministries that our parish sponsors and Jesus' teaching that "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21).

That said, there are those (and I admit to being one of these folks myself) who do like to understand in broad terms the finances of organizations to which they plan to make a commitment. If you belong in that group, let me offer a few key facts based on our 2021 Budget (a plan that we laid out last January, when COVID remained hugely unpredictable, but one that, thank God, we have been able to follow quite closely):

<u>Our income this year will total around \$225,000</u>, of which \$206,000 was pledged by Brendanites this time last year. Special fundraising events of one kind and another would normally boost that figure considerably, but these were of course limited by COVID restrictions until quite recently.

<u>Our expenses will total about \$250,000</u>, of which fully 50% goes to salaries and benefits. Our operating costs (mortgage payments, utilities, insurance, cleaning, etc.) total a little over \$70,000. We also pay an assessment to the Diocese of about \$26,000. This leaves just a little over \$5,000 for all the ministries and programs we sponsor—a true indication of how heavily they rely on volunteer leadership and participation.

Finally, as I hope you know, our CRIES Advocacy organization oversees donations equal to 10% of our income each month (for a total of about \$22,500 this year) to our neighbors in need here at home and around the globe.

To return, however, to where I began: we value your pledges, however large or small, not principally because of the dollar amount they will add to our bottom line in 2022 but because they reflect your commitment to **walking in love** with others and with Our Lord.
