The Priest's Corner

Let's Talk About Single-Use Plastics

Did you know that by 2050 there will be more plastics floating around in the ocean than fish? Scientists have been reporting for years that plastics and other debris are choking our oceans and waterways.

Plastics in the oceans kill over a million seabirds, 100,000 marine mammals, and countless fish every year, according to the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration. Plastic chemicals can be absorbed in our bodies — 93% of Americans age six or older test positive for BPA, which can cause cancer and birth defects, according to the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences. Our tap water and bottled water are both loaded with micro plastics. We are hoping to show the movie, "Bag It" (which is a simple and interestingly entertaining explanation of the problem), at church after an upcoming Sunday coffee hour. Look for details soon.

At our recent diocesan convention, we resolved that "each parish encourage its parishioners to recycle, reuse and reduce their uses of water, electricity, gasoline and other fossil fuels, and plastics, which are polluting the ocean." In particular we are encouraged to reduce the reliance on single-use plastics such as grocery bags, straws and Styrofoam cups/plates.

On **Sunday, January 20**° at 1:30 p.m. our diocese will collaborate with the Unitarians and Friends on a focused approach to end/lessen single-use plastics in our organizations. All parishioners of St. Brendan's are invited to attend this organizing meeting. (Contact Linda Schneider, lindalans@comcast.net, for more information.)

In the meantime, consider swapping these 10 single-use items for their reusable alternative:

- 1) Plastic Straws 2) Plastic Water Bottles 3) Coffee Cups with Plastic Lids 4) Plastic Grocery Bags 5) Plastic Wrap
- 6) Plastic Take-Out Containers 7) Plastic Bags in general 8) Plastic Cutlery 9) Plastic Party Cups and 10) Six-Pack Rings

Parish Notes. St. Brendan's Vestry met on Monday and these were among the subjects discussed:

- The parish ended the 2018 budget year with a \$27,009 surplus. Looking ahead, the church anticipates a surplus of \$4,540 for the end of 2019.
- After reports of little heat in the chapel, the church's heating-cooling company was called and a furnace motor was replaced at the cost of \$603. The company also repaired vents and dampers that were making noise in the floor on the right side of the sanctuary replaced at the cost of \$360.
- Several vestry members volunteered to host a series of small-group brunches in their homes to welcome newcomers to the parish.

Seeking Vestry Nominations. Would you like to be a candidate for St. Brendan's Vestry? The parish will elect three people to join the nine-member group responsible for the financial and real affairs of the church. The election will take place on January 27 at the parish's annual meeting. Candidates must be willing to serve for a term of three years.

St. Brendan's bylaws require vestry nominees to be baptized persons 16 years of age or older, financial contributors of record at least once within the past 12 months, and regular worshipers in the congregation for six months prior to the annual meeting.

Everyone is invited to attend trainings on how to assist immigrants and refugees with legal accompaniment and home hosting. The workshops, sponsored by New Sanctuary Pittsburgh, are free and open to the public. They will be held January 22, 6:30 to 9:00 p.m., at St. Andrew Lutheran Church, 304 Morewood Ave., Pittsburgh. Child care will be available.

One training will provide information on how to provide legal accompaniment for impacted people as they interact with law enforcement, ICE, and the courts system. Bring your questions! You will learn how to accompany immigrants to ICE check-ins, court hearings, and other interactions with law enforcement or the courts.

The other training will focus on how to provide housing for impacted people. Learn to be a good host home, hear about some typical host home experiences, and learn how to become part of the critical team that offers housing in their homes and owned (but not occupied) properties.
