## The Priest's Corner

#### "So, You're Not Hosting Christmas Dinner this Year?!?!"

I remember it well. After 30 years of preparing and hosting the traditional Slovak "Stedry vecer, Generous Evening" meal, my mother finally handed it over to my brother's wife. This was huge. It even meant the meal would take place in a different home.

My mother told me she really could still manage it all, however, she did forget the "balbaky" last Christmas Eve. She teared up a bit when she recalled how she used to complain that she always felt she got stuck with having to do the majority of the work by herself, and that "the younger ones never volunteered. Same people year after year!" (Haven't we heard that over the years at St. Brendan's?)

So the younger one, Betty Ann, did the "Stedry vecer" that next year. And it was very good— even though, "she did the prayers during the Oplatky sharing and her honey was in the original bottle it came in," according to my mom. My mother only shared this "little observation" with me. She said she didn't want to hurt Betty Ann's feelings.

So what's it like to pass the torch to the newer generation? The human spirit wants this, but it's hard to give up. It's hard for those who have been doing things for years to find their new fit when another "takes the wheel." Some people just avoid getting involved in the new way. Some stay away because they sincerely want the new efforts to have room to take the direction into the next generation. Others stay away because they have a hard time seeing some of the things they created not as important to the new approach. Others downright can't refrain from being outrightly critical. I guess the question becomes WWJD (What Would Jesus Do?) I have opinions about how I think we ought to behave, but sometimes it's easier said than done. I just offer my dear mother's clearly human, but tinged with the divine way of doing it. She went to the new "Stedry vecer" every year until her Alzheimer's made it impossible. And every year she went, she whispered in my ear that Betty Ann said the Oplatky prayers and the honey was still in the bottle it came in. My mother's been with the Lord for several years now, and we still gather at Betty Ann's for our special "Generous Evening" meal. We added a new ritual to our celebration. When we pass around the honey to sweeten our Oplatky, we all say aloud, "Mary Ann, The honey's still in the bottle it came in."

  out there for us to assist women and victims who are in need of shelter and protection.
- A newer attendee is opening doors for us to help people find legal work around immigration law.
- A brand-new attendee (two weeks) is going to sand our outdoor altar and prepare it for use throughout the summer.

There's even more. Now for those of you have been around a while and are making room for others, please know your continued involvement is necessary and vital to our life at St. Brendan's. You are not being eliminated; so don't self-eliminate. Stay involved in your niche and preferred place, own it, steer it but more importantly, find your "new fit" in those ministries and activities that are in your DNA but under some newer and different tweaks. See yourself now as the "seasoned wisdom containers" who have much to offer and know people.
