The Priest's Corner

Sudden Spiritual Insight in Traffic on Penn Avenue

TIME & LOCATION: 8:15 a.m., Wednesday, Penn Avenue, traveling from Strip District to Fort Pitt Bridge, one-lane traffic, parked cars on the right along the curb.

One thing I remember from my training in public speaking is that when participants begin to use the new phrases or phraseology that you are using in their comments or questions, you are making an impact. They are likely getting the content and moving toward some level of agreement and acceptance. Trust is building and you might well be getting your point across. There's a chance that this will result in behavior change.

Professional speakers are trained to look for these signals and identify the individuals who are demonstrating the potential. You then encourage these vocal ones' participation because they now are the most credible teachers of the material in the room. You invite them to talk about the subject matter more than you speak about it. Their peers will be more influenced by them than by you. Your job is to affirm the good content and subtly redirect the unclear or mistaken content.

Bottom line: when others say and do what you have said and done, your participation in their lives has introduced some newness or an alternative worthwhile way of thinking. In rarer cases some positive, new behavior change may have been initiated.

So as I'm inching my way through the bumper to bumper, crowded Penn Avenue one-lane traffic; the driver in front of me seems to notice the parked car to his right indicate a desire to enter the traffic flow. He suddenly stops as if to make room for the parked car to join; the potential enterer must not have moved quickly enough for the once-generous-feeling driver because he frustratedly closed the way-in to the curbside car.

I didn't like the stops and starts and just wanted to get to the bridge. As I passed, I didn't want to look at the parked car's driver; but did. I hesitantly decided to make room for the driver; and after a short but seemingly endless entry period, she steered the car into the flow of traffic. I had a sense of relief, hope and self-satisfaction. We were crawling our way to the Fort Pitt Bridge.

All was well, and my patience was apparent — even to me — as I was pleased with my friendly, cordial driving prowess. Then that woman, who I went out of my way to help, decided she was going to let another parked car into the flow — which now I considered "the laboriously slow-moving flow." Egads! How dare she!

Then a gentle nudge formed in me and arrived in my conscious mind. "When they do as you have done, you've likely influenced a positive behavior change." This spiritual insight led me to turn my frustration into peace. It made incredulity become gratitude. It made a frustrated man, milliseconds away from viciously honking the horn at an inconvenience, become a satisfied contributor to making the world a better place. Indeed it was a great trip home.

In the entrance to the church you will find voter registration forms. They have the mailing address for Allegheny County. There are a few without the address for those who may not live in the county. Please affix a first-class stamp.

We are urging each parishioner to take three. When you are out to eat, ask your server if he or she is registered. Ask the clerk at the grocery store. Many service workers do not have the time to seek out a form and register. Ask your friends and neighbors, too.

If we all registered three people, we could make a real difference locally and even nationally. October 7 is the deadline to be registered for this year's November 5 election. Applications for an absentee ballot must be made by October 29.

We will also have information in the coming weeks on some registration drives at schools and local stores.
