Why do we wear Red? Red in the color of the Holy Order of Bishops, so it's used for all Episcopal (a bishop is an "episcopos" in Greek) visitations, consecrations, ordinations, and confirmations. The color red also symbolizes the "tongues of flame" that rested on Jesus' followers as they heard the rush of Holy wind.

The Book of Common prayer tells us that the Day of Pentecost is one of the feasts that is "especially appropriate for Baptism."

So please join us Sunday, at the 10 am service as we welcome the newest member into the Body of Christ and into St. Brendan's faith community. Please wear red.
