1. What is the Cookie Walk?

The Cookie Walk is our fall fundraiser. It has been held on the Saturday before Thanksgiving since 2000.

When is this year's Cookie Walk? November 23 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

3. How can I participate? (In lots of ways!)

- by helping to distribute the flyers on the narthex table
- by taking a sign to put in your yard
- by helping to decorate the church on November 21
- by helping in the kitchen on November 23
- by helping in the Cookie Walk at the choir room on November 23
- by taking entrance fees at the door on November 23
- by helping clean up on November 23 (sign-up sheets for all these are on the narthex table)
- but, MOST OF ALL by BAKING COOKIES to sell for the Cookie Walk

4. How does the Cookie Walk work?

The cookies are placed in trays on tables in the choir room (one kind for each pan – that's why we ask for batches of 10 dozen). Customers purchase an empty cookie box and fill it with the cookies of their choice. Please see the "Cookie Jar" in the fellowship hall for more details and sign-up sheets.

5. What about the "Holiday Arts and Craft Show," which occurs at the same time?

This is a shoppers' event at which visitors can browse and purchase items, many of which are handmade, from more than 40 vendors located on St. Brendan's main floor. Since there will be a wide variety of items for purchase – clothing, jewelry, home décor, Christmas decorations, toys, etc. – it's a great opportunity to start your Christmas shopping. Did you know? Twenty-three members of Christ Episcopal Church, North Hills, created St. Brendan's in 1987 as a mission parish, with the love and support of their former rector and parishioners? For our first three years, St. Brendan's services were held on Saturday evenings at Heritage Presbyterian Church on Rochester Road, where we also hosted Wednesday evening Holy Eucharist and classes. Sunday Morning Prayer services were followed by Chime Choir practice. Our first wedding and baptism were held in 1987, and a mere four years later

groundbreaking for the original church building was held on May 8, 1991. Our first service in our sanctuary, which is now the social hall, was on Palm Sunday, 1992. Several of the original members are still active in our church life.
