The Priest's Corner

Three Needs Made Their Way to Me This Week

If you've been reading this Corner, you're aware that we are trying to get more knowledge as to which needs people coming to church today expect to be met. We live in an Age of Discretion, born out of the reality that people are balancing so many competing priorities; as such, we have to pick and choose among them based on how they connect with the rest of our lives and whether they, in fact, help us lead those lives. As a result, things we experience in church, like preaching, worship, congregational life, music and ministries, are weighed against other pressing experiences and commitments. Since we have limited time, resources and energy, some things make the cut; others do not. We hope church experiences at St. Brendan's meet people's needs and "make the cut." I know we're committed to do what we can to meet the needs.

I hoped that last week's questions would motivate people to let me know their needs. Three such needs found their way to me. (Thank you.) Here's my paraphrasing of them:

- I'm at St. Brendan's right now just to be nurtured. I'm exhausted. Nurture me "without causing me to feel guilty" for a while and I'll be ready to volunteer for things later.
- Give me something spiritual and meaningful to share with my adult child who needs some hope.
- I'd like to find a friend or two.

I don't know about you, but my sense is that this is a great start. There will soon be opportunities for you to place your input in the offering plate as well as a "Needs Box." We're considering having a few people asking the question randomly and helping to make these needs known. (If you have any suggestions to make it comfortable for people to share and learn needs, please talk to me or anyone on the vestry.)

Regarding the first need shared above, I'll call it "guilt-free nurturance for a period of time." I'm going to talk to Karen Peters (who assembles the Sunday bulletin) and together we'll come up with language to encourage those wanting to predominantly focus on "restoring and refreshing themselves" to please do so. We'll prominently say this in the Welcome portion of the bulletin. Also, I'll speak publicly again about the notion of "Sabbath rest." It's a Biblical and Jewish notion that gave people the opportunity and encouragement to simply rest while being within the church community. All of us ought to be sensitive to this need and treat ourselves to the same self-care when needed. Also, I'd encourage all of us who ask people to join in our activities and ministries to perhaps start these connecting conversations with phrases that are sensitive to people's need to be on Sabbath rest. Perhaps a helpful opening line might be: "If you feel ready for more involvement at St, Brendan's ..." or "If you are on "Sabbath rest...

ignore me, but ..." This will often prompt, "What's Sabbath rest?" And off you go toward a meaningful conversation that will likely connect them more deeply.

So let's keep up the great spirit of St. Brendan's and help others find their way to this meaningful, relevant community of believers.
