The Priest's Corner

St. Francis and Blessing Pets

Please bring your pets (dogs, cats, rabbits, gerbils, geckos, horses, llamas, etc.) to our animal blessing at the 10:00 am liturgy on Sunday, October 6. They will be blessed during the liturgy. There will be another pet blessing at 11:30 (you know — just in case your pet needs that extra boost! LOL!) Actually, The 11:30 blessing is for those in the neighborhood who may not attend liturgy, but want their pets blessed. There will be veterinarians and other animal-needs vendors in the social hall after the service. You can get your picture taken there with your pet, for free!

Stories abound about how St. Francis could communicate with animals and feel at one with all of creation. He would walk great distances to share God's Good News. One day Francis stopped to preach near the town of Bevagna in Italy where he spotted a great number of birds of all varieties. Doves, crows and all sorts of birds swept up in the moment. Francis left his human friends and ran after them. The birds landed and waited patiently for Francis. He greeted the birds in his usual way, expecting them to scurry off into the air as he spoke. But they didn't move.

Francis called them "brother and sister birds" and told them to praise their Creator and always love God. He explained that God gave them feathers for clothes, wings to fly and made them noble among all creatures. They make their home in thin, pure air and without sowing or reaping they receive the Creator's guidance and protection. At this the birds were said to spread their wings, stretch their necks and make a path for Francis to walk through them touching their heads and bodies. He blessed them, then they flew off. After this, Francis wondered aloud why he never preached to birds before, and from that day on he made a habit out of it. The birds are said to have responded in turn.

One day a brother brought to Francis a rabbit, who had been caught in a trap. Francis advised the rabbit to be more alert in the future. He then released the rabbit on the ground to go on its way, but the rabbit hopped back onto the saint's lap. The rabbit was taken farther into the woods, but found its way back to Francis again. This sort of animal-human connection happened repeatedly, and Francis saw it as an opportunity to praise the glory of God. Fish also obeyed Francis. When one was caught, Francis always returned it to the water. On several occasions, reports of fish lingering around the boat from which Francis preached ran rampant. They would swim off only after Francis gave them permission to leave.

Perhaps the most famous animal connection is between Francis and the wolf of Gubbio. The story goes that this wolf was terrifying the people of Gubbio, killing and eating not only animals but people, too. The people took up arms and went after the wolf, but they were no match for it. Francis had pity on the frightened people and decided to go out and meet the wolf. People

warned Francis, but he insisted that God would take care of him. The wolf charged out of the woods, but Francis made the sign of the cross, and the power of God caused the wolf to slow down. Francis was able to calm the wolf and in time the people of Gubbio made a pact to feed the wolf, and the wolf became meek. From that day on the people kept their pact, and the wolf lived for two more years among the townspeople, going from door to door for food.

Beautiful, sweet stories, aren't they? There was a special connection that Francis had with animals and nature. This is why we connect our pet blessing with this humble, earth- and nature-loving man from Assisi named Francis.

In the entrance to the church you will find voter registration forms. They have the mailing address for Allegheny County. There are a few without the address for those who may not live in the county. Please affix a first-class stamp.

We are urging each parishioner to take three. When you are out to eat, ask your server if he or she is registered. Ask the clerk at the grocery store. Many service workers do not have the time to seek out a form and register. Ask your friends and neighbors, too.

If we all registered three people, we could make a real difference locally and even nationally. October 7 is the deadline to be registered for this year's November 5 election. Applications for an absentee ballot must be made by October 29.
